

2025 NCIHC Language Access Champion Award Submission Information





The National Council on Interpreting in Health Care (NCIHC) is pleased to announce the call for nominations for its 2025 Language Access Champion award.

The purpose of this award is to honor a person, a program, or an organization whose work has contributed to improving the lives of all persons through the promotion of language access in health care.

NCIHC will present the award to the honoree during the NCIHC Language Access Congress being held September 25-27, 2025, in Little Rock, Arkansas.

Nomination Process & Criteria

The NCIHC Language Access Champion award is a recognition that comes directly from NCIHC members.

Please note:

• Persons who are submitting nominations must be NCIHC members in good standing, holding any type of membership status, but nominees do not need to be NCIHC members. Current NCIHC board members are not eligible.

Deadline for nominations is Friday, March 25, 2025, 12:00 PM US-Eastern | 11:00 PM US-Central | 9:00 PM US-Pacific

To prepare for filling out the nomination form, you will need to include the following information.

- Nominator (person offering the nomination)
 - Name
 - Position
 - Organization/Affiliation
 - Contact telephone number
 - E-mail address
- Nominee (person/program/organization being recommended for award)
 - Name (primary contact for nominating a program or an organization)
 - Position
 - Organization/Affiliation
 - Contact number and/or email address
- A description of a person, a program or an organization that demonstrates their outstanding commitment and contribution to language access.

Once submitted, the online form does not allow for edits.

It may be helpful to remember the NCIHC mission and vision:

FAQs NCIHC Language Access Champion

Who can make a nomination?

Any current NCIHC member in good standing can submit a nomination.

Must the candidate be an NCIHC member? What if I am not sure if they are a member?

Candidates for the Language Access Champion Award do not have to be an NCIHC member. However, current board members are not eligible.

Where can I find the nomination form?

Click on the 2025 NCIHC Language Access Champion Nomination link to submit your nomination.

Must the candidate be an interpreter?

The award may be given to anyone in the field of language access in healthcare, regardless of position. Thus, Directors/Coordinators of Interpreter Services, healthcare providers, administrative staff, managers, and other staff in addition to interpreters may be nominated. In addition, individuals in the larger healthcare arena, including but not limited to, insurers, funders, grant makers, policymakers, and other advocates may be nominated.

How will award recipients be determined?

The selection of the award recipient will be based on the strength of the particular nomination as deemed by the NCIHC Board of Directors.

When is the deadline for nominations?

The deadline for nominations is Tuesday, March 25, 2025, at 12:00 p.m. Eastern.

When will the award recipient be announced?

NCIHC will inform the recipient at least three weeks before the AMM to be held on Monday, April 28, 2025.

When will the award be presented?

NCIHC will announce the winner during our Annual Membership Meeting (AMM) on April 28, 2025, and formally recognize the winner in person at the NCIHC Congress, taking place September 25–27, 2025, in Little Rock, Arkansas.

Who were the previous honorees?
